

REDRUTH SCHOOL LEADS THE WAY IN SCHOOL LEAGUE TABLES

The recently published school league tables have seen mixed fortunes for schools in Cornwall. The new Government Performance Tables now include 2 key measures to judge the performance of secondary schools.

Progress 8

This score shows how much progress students at this school made between the end of Key Stage 2 and the end of Key Stage 4, compared to students across England who got similar results at the end of Key Stage 2. This is based upon results in up to 8 qualifications, which include, English, maths, 3 English Baccalaureate qualifications including sciences, computer science, history, geography and languages and 3 other additional approved qualifications.

Attainment 8

Schools get a score based on how well students have performed in up to 8 qualifications which include; English, maths, 3 English Baccalaureate qualifications including sciences, computer science, history, geography and languages and 3 other additional approved qualifications

Out of 32 secondary schools in Cornwall, Redruths progress score of +0.36, places them in the top 4 schools in Cornwall and in the top 10% of schools nationally. The attainment score is equally impressive with the average grade per student being a B- in GCSE's taken last Summer and 69% achieving a C grade in both English and maths GCSE.

Headteacher, Craig Martin said, "This represents a continuing upward trend of both progress and achievement at the school over the last 3 years. The school is now regularly oversubscribed and is looking to improve still further in future years. I am delighted by the progress made by all the students and the school over the last few years. The combination of hard work, great relationships between students, staff and parents as well as a focus on young people enjoying their school life has really paid dividends at school, home and in our community.
